From 23rd to 29th August 2010, for the fifth time consecutively, the International Award Summer School will open its doors in Osterburken, Germany. Young adults planning to become Award leaders, as well as experienced leaders wanting to deepen and share their knowledge are invited to participate in an *Award Leaders Course* (Basic Leaders Course + Expedition Course), an *Award Officers Course* and different *Workshops* held in English language.

In the tradition of Kurt Hahn*), we strongly believe that to explain the Award is not enough, and that we also have to take care that its spirit can be experienced in every single seminar. Hence, in Summer School, "learning by doing" is the most important seminar method. Just like Award helpers, trainers in our Award courses are basically not supposed to act for themselves but to make the participants act.

But there is more going on than just a couple of courses! There is "service" – because everybody is involved in course duties, such as providing food, preparing lunch and cleaning the kitchen; "adventure" – because the first part involves a tour in the countryside; "skills" – because a documentation is to be prepared, and "physical recreation" – because everybody can start or end his / her day with some guided physical activity.

Gold Award participants can use International Award Summer School as their *Residential Project*, experienced Award leaders as a *Train the Trainer* seminar. Again, Summer School 2010 will not be a youth exchange in the first instance, but mainly a sequence of different leaders courses with the minimum age of 16 as a most important condition for taking part successfully.

Course Descriptions

Award Leaders Course (ALC). This first part of IASS 2010 involves both a *Basic Leaders Course* and an *Expedition Course* combined into one single seminar. Focus is on the Award's philosophy ("What is the Award?") and – due to its legal, security and local networking implications – the Expeditions section. Starting point is the German Award's slogan – "Plus est en Vous – There is more in you (than you think)".

Award Officers Course (AOC). Based on a proper understanding of the Award's philosophy, this second IASS 2010 course has its focus on the Award's management ("How to run the Award?"). Hence, the course has got the worldwide unique form of an *Award Management Game* (business simulation), which is supposed to prepare leaders "live" for their different tasks or to improve their work in different areas. The global strategy paper "Six Pathways of the Award" is used as an original point.

Workshops. There are actually two tracks of workshops during IASS 2010 – one between the two "big" courses, one at the end. For these parts, participants are invited to run their own short courses actually. If they have got any specific experiences with the Award or any specific skills useful in the work with it, which they would like to share with us – they should not hesitate to do so.

Train The Trainers (TtT). Experienced Award leaders who want to become Award trainers are introduced into this role and adopt it, coached by experienced trainers, in the different courses. *First TtT meeting is happening already on Monday, 8 pm.*
